School, is the editor-in-chief of the newspaper.

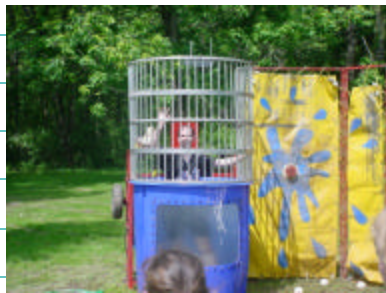
Almost everything submitted will make it into the newspaper. When you go to your computer class, you will receive a sheet explaining the criteria we are looking of

write a research report. With the help of Mrs. McCaffrey, students also learned to add templates and clipart to their project. The result of all this hard work was a fabulous presentation.

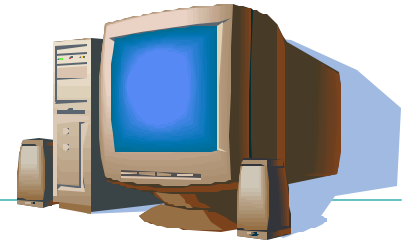

A question and answer session is a good way to quickly capture the attention of readers. You can either compile questions that you've received since the last edition or you can summarize some generic questions that are frequently asked about your organization.

A listing of names and titles of managers in your organization is a good way to give your newsletter a personal touch. If your organization is small, you may want to list the names of all employees.

If you have any prices of standard products or services, you can

include a listing of those here. You may want to refer your readers to any other forms of communication that you've created for your organization. image or some other graphic.

You can also use this space to remind readers to mark their calendars for a regular event, such as a breakfast meeting for vendors every third Tuesday of the month, or a biannual charity auction.
