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WEEKLY ANGEL HIGHLIGHTS

Pre-K 3: In celebration of Arbor Day today, we planted and watered a new tree for the garden area in the parking lot with our guardian angel 5th grade class. The Butterflies Magnolia tree will have deep yellow flowers that will change to small pinkish-red shaped fruit in the fall.

Pre-K 4: PreK 4 sang the months of the year song and had fun placing the months in the correct order. At the same time they were able to identify their birth month.

Kindergarten: Kindergarten has been busy this week. We planted basil seeds for Earth Day on Monday and apple seeds for Arbor Day (which we are celebrating today even though we already planted the seeds). We are caring for the soil and watching for when our seeds germinate. Today we are learning about the Tuskegee Airmen, as the governor designated today as a special day in their honor. Also, we watched part of an interview with Shelly Carter, the nation's first black woman fire chief.

Grade 1: This week First Grade celebrated Earth Day by learning the history of the holiday, reading stories about it, and using manipulatives and technology.

Grade 2: This week Grade Two continues to do an amazing job writing cursive letters! Also...It's Spring planting time in our classroom. We are waiting for our zinnia seeds to bloom!

Grade 3: All grade 3 students showed incredible growth on their NWEA Tests. They have grown so much since January!

Grade 4: Grade four is learning about series and parallel electrical circuits, and will soon make a light bulb light up. Grade 4 also worked together with their Pre-K 4 buddies on special projects for Mrs. LeBlanc and Miss Leonka.

Grade 5: Our Grade 5 students worked a lot on new things this week in the classroom! They did a phenomenal job on their NWEA Map Tests & received compliments from staff about their good behavior.

Grade 6: In Literature class, students analyzed the lyrics of "Earth Song" written and performed by Michael Jackson in 1995. They found Christian ideas and symbolism in the words and in the visual depictions contained in the music video.

Grade 7: In Religion, students studied the Corporal Works of Mercy and explored ways that all of us can perform them in our daily lives.

Grade 8: In Art, our grade 8 students used shaving cream and liquid water colors to create a background for their Famous Buildings Project.
